It is the responsibility of every CyberCorps student to maintain high grades, participate in the courses and activities of the CyberCorps program, and meet the reporting requirements set forth below. Failure to do so could cause termination of the student from the program, and the student would then be liable for any obligations thus owed to the federal government.

Academic Records

All students must turn in a current transcript at the beginning of each semester. Dropping below a GPA of 3.2 will require the student to participate in active mentoring to improve their grades.

New students are required to turn in an advisor-approved program of study within a month after starting the program (these can be changed, with the consent of their advisor, at any time).

OPM Job Bank

SFS students are required to register on the SFS website maintained by OPM and to file quarterly reports on their progress in seeking internships or employment.

Required courses

Each student is required to take courses of the **Cybersescurity track** in Computer Science as well **participate in** the general seminar for CyberCorps students each semester.

Students must spend an appropriate amount of time in the laboratory on projects customized to them, developed with the instructor of the required seminar.

Unless otherwise noted, items that are required to be turned in should be hand-delivered to the C-SAIT director.
